Dear Members:

January 18th Mr. Bob Galloway, from the law firm representing the club, went to Jackson and met with two of the Asst. U.S. Attorneys in regards to our lease petition. They stated their office found no fault with what we were trying to do since the state, county, city, harbor and port commission and property owners north of U.S. 90 did not object. They further stated that likely within a month a consent order without a hearing would be issued by the Federal Judges office. Keep your fingers crossed!

The building finance committee has been appointed and will be charged with the responsibility of investigating the possible ways to finance our building program. Their recommendations will be made to the Governing Board who, in turn, must approve and present to the membership along with the basic and alternate building plans for adoption by majority vote at a general membership meeting in the near future.

The Governing Board appointed a special committee several months ago to study the club by-laws and recommend revisions necessary to accommodate changes and new situations that were not anticipated when the original by-laws were written. The Committee has completed its task and their recommendations made to the Governing Board. This, too, will necessitate approval by the general membership soon.

All of the club committees are hard at work planning activities and programs for this year. This includes everything from dances to regattas. They need workers to help carry out the many aspects of the club operation. Come join with us to make this year a memorable one.

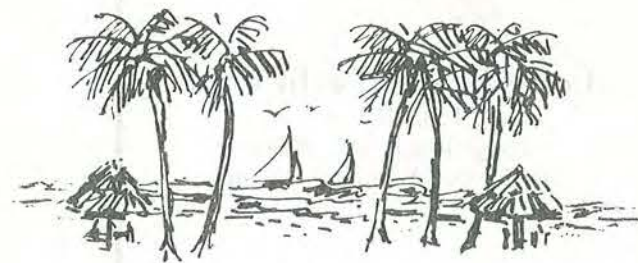


LADIES' AUXILIARY NEWS:

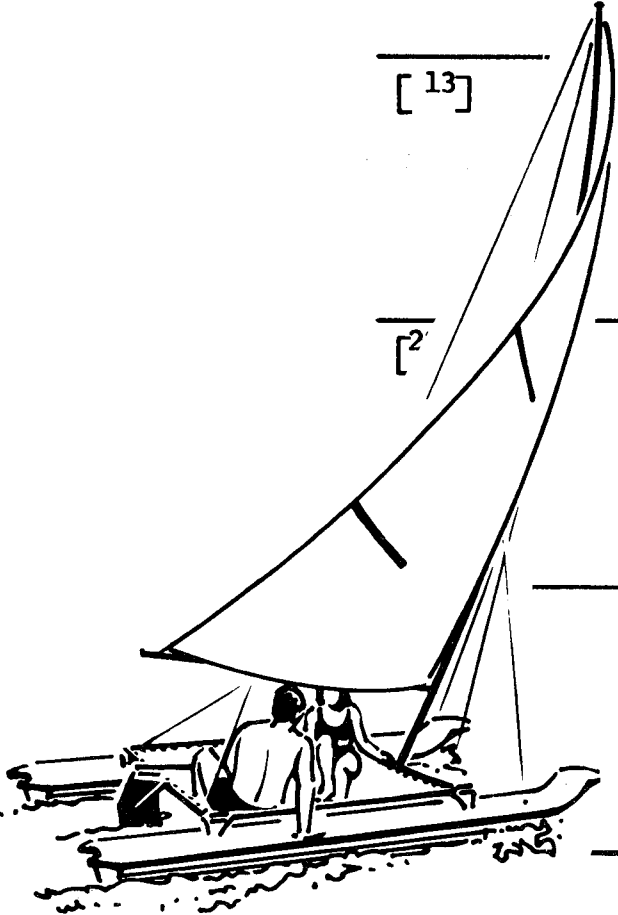
