Mardi Gras is just around the corner and the Mardi Gras Committee has planned a fund raising event to raise funds to help build a LBYC float.

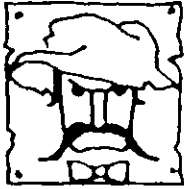

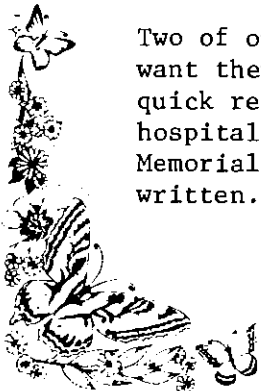

MEMBERSHIP REPORT

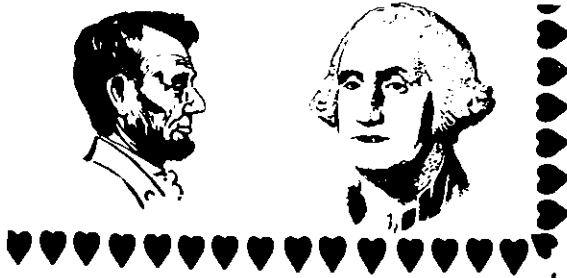
