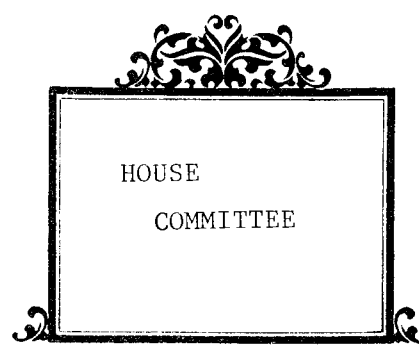
DOCKS AND PIERS:

Also, we thank Mr. Robert (Bob) Harmo for all the housekeeping supplies for keeping the club house shining.

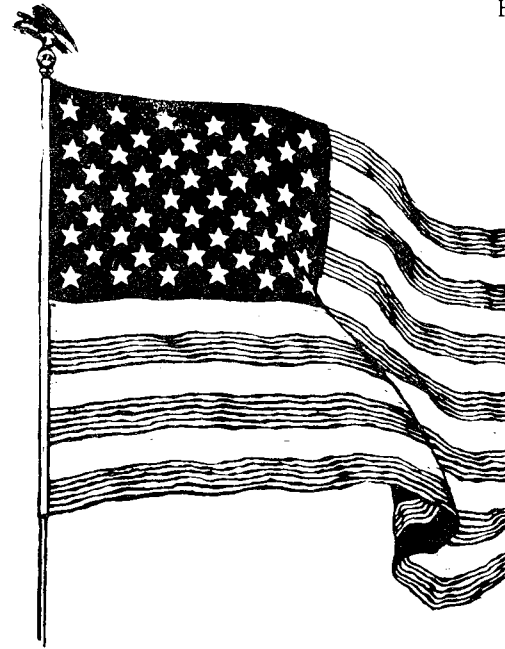

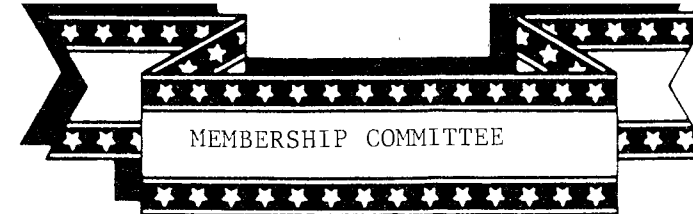
AUXILIARY REPORT

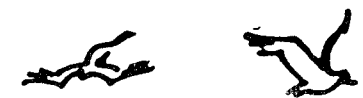
