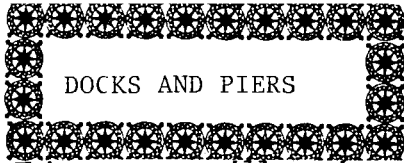
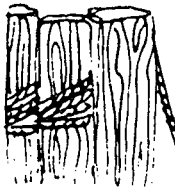

Tom has accepted the position of Beach Master this year, and any questions pertaining to the beach should be referred to him.

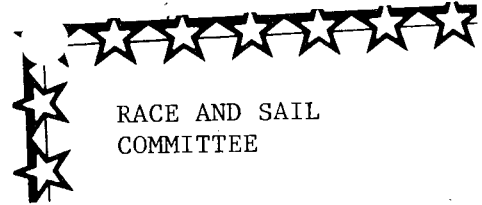

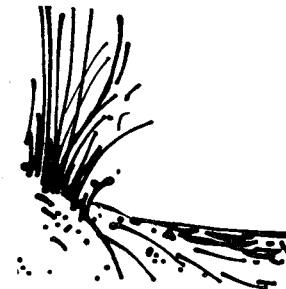

Please make your reservations by February 13, if you want a seat or breakfast, or both. Call Lulla - 864-8761 or sign up at the bar.

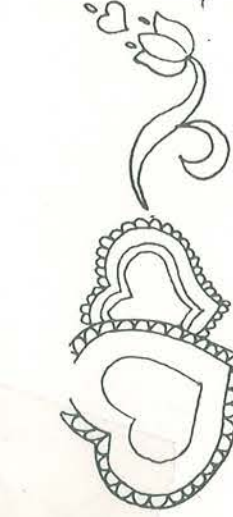
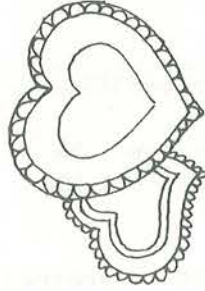

Try to invite a prospective member to a function at the club, show them our beautiful new building, introduce them to other members, and let them see what a fine group we have and how much we have to offer.

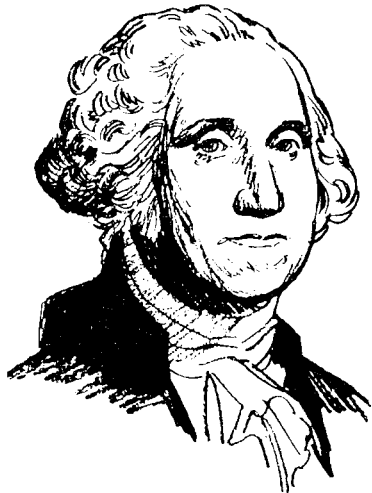

The LBYC nylon windbreaker is waiting in your size for the primary sponsor of the most new members before April 30th. Smooth sailing.

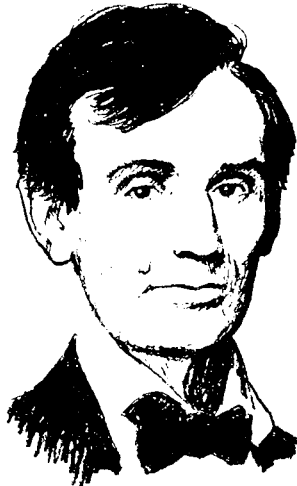
