all night. Many thanks to Jean-Ann Swenson and Gerry Bell for helping with decorating and planning.

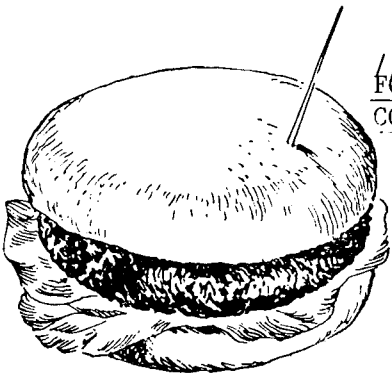

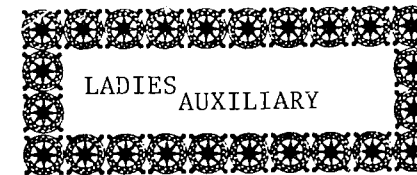
Spring is in the air and the wind is in the sails and the food is in the oven.

The Board voted on and approved the printing of guest cards for potential members and these must be signed by the members for the limited use of a prospective member. Cards will be available through me.

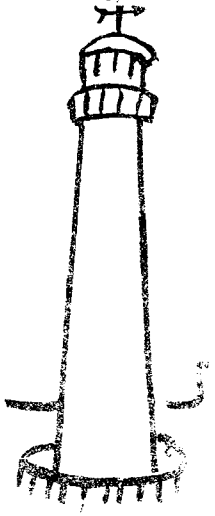
