Dear Fellow Members:

At that time, we will also have a general explanation of the financial structure of the club, and discuss the desirability of installing a swimming pool. This would be a major expense, and we would like to know what priority the membership places on a pool.

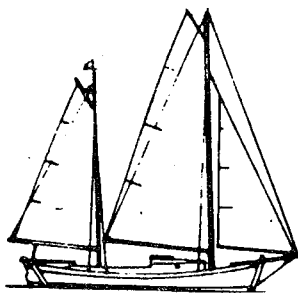
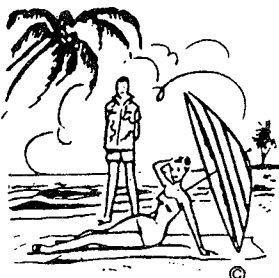
.....CHEAP THRILLS.....MAY 10TH.....
