LBYC entered two Flying Scots in the Race Week Regatta at GYC July 4 & 5. Sailing in Capdeville were Kathy Sirokman, Jud Williams, Charley Morgan and John Burke. David Wyatt, Ronda Torok,

and Bill Woodcock sailed to the Open Scot division. Although not placing well, all participants had a great time. Craig & Terry Nichols sailed their tri-maran in an attempt to persuade the GYA to establish a handicap for craft other than monohulls. Craig maintains that they easily captured first place.

'Bullet Proof', a 36' Catalina Tall Mast owned by Dr. Don Roberts, placed 3rd in Class D in the Gulfport to Pensacola race, June 26, 27, & 28. This finish was 18th in a fleet of 162 boats.

We had no entry in the Meigs at FWYC but we are looking forward to sailing in the Biloxi Invitational July 25 & 26.

The R & S Committee had a meeting on July 8 to discuss various issues, among which was the new sign at Long Beach harbor regarding sail boats.
