**RACE AND SAIL COMMITTEE**

Bay Waveland Yacht Club hosted the 68th Sir Thomas Lipton Cup Challenge, on 5, 6, & 7 September. Twenty-four (24) Flying Scots were entered from 24 GYA clubs. Spectators were even more numerous! In the first of four races, John Burke drove with Charles Morgan and Jud Williams handling the sheets. Holly Murray skippered the 2nd race with Kathy Sirokman and Betty Kohrman crewing. The 3rd race saw Kathy Wyatt and Kathy Sirokman as crew for Laurie McCosh. Monday's 4th race took a while to get off due to shifty winds, but Jud and Charles were steered around the course by Andy Christ. Andy was an alternate skipper for Sam McCauley who had to withdraw with a sprained back. Each of our representatives served LBYC well. Overall, we finished twenty-first. BWYC repeated as champions, while Pensacola YC edged out NOYC by a quarter of a point for second. Since a host club cannot serve two years in a row, the Lipton's will be in Pensacola next year. Now that will be a trip - in more ways than one.!

The Flying Scot Gulf District Championships were sailed in Fairhope this year. David & Kathy Wyatt and Charles Morgan competed with 28 entries in a four race series with one throwout. They finished exactly in the middle at 14th. Winds ranged from 0 to 25 knots with an occasional squall. FYC will host the Wadewitz Regatta on Sept 26 & 27. Perhaps this explains why our sails were continually left at the club. Luckily we discovered they were left for the final time after we had only traveled 20 miles toward Long Beach Sunday afternoon. Concentration often ends at the conclusion of a race!

Capedeville competition continued at BWYC on Sept 19 & 20 with the Monk Smith Regatta. John Burke and David Wyatt crewed for Kathy Sirokman in the first race on Saturday. Due to arrival of wind late in the day, that was the

This is a fun series that will be conducted each Sunday afternoon through November 22nd for any boat wishing to participate (includes power boats I understand). Weekly awards are given (bar tabs & trophies) and there will be overall series trophies at the conclusion. The first week saw participation of 13 craft while the 20th was greeted by 14 entries. PHRF and Portsmouth handicapping systems are used to determine the winners. If you haven't been out yet, plan now to enter this fun event! Only \$5.00 per entry.
