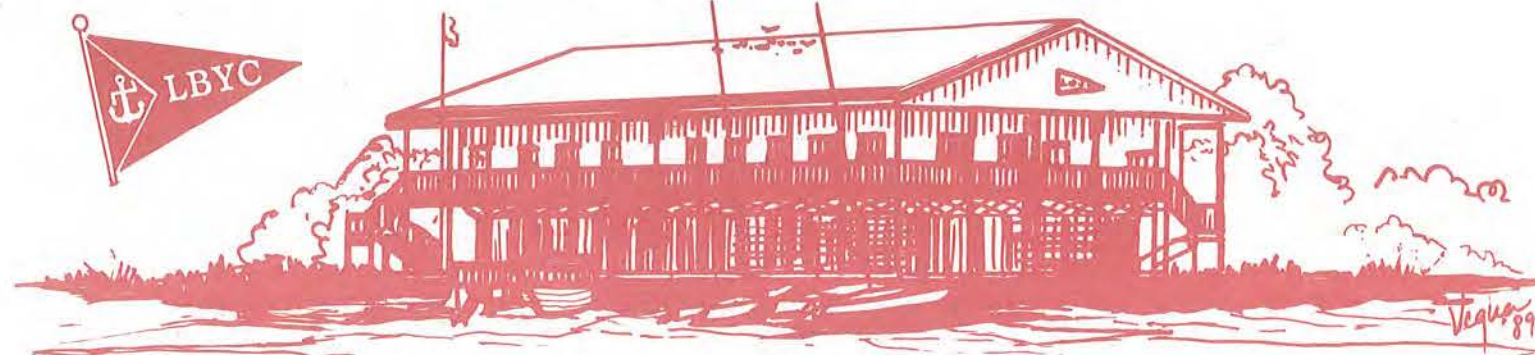

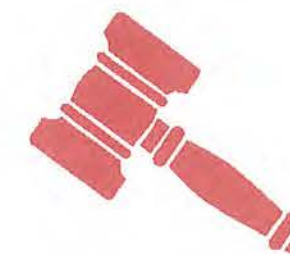

Original Hot Brown
Cheese Sauce:

2 tlbs. butter
1/4 c. flour
2 c. milk
1/4 c. grated sharp cheese
1/4 c. grated Parmesan
1/4 teas. salt
1/2 teas. Worcestshire sauce

Melt butter, blend in flour, add milk, cheeses and etc. Stir constantly until smooth and thickened. Set aside.

Sandwiches:

8 slices trimmed toast
1 lb. sliced turkey breast
8 slices tomato
8 slices bacon, partially cooked or
1/4 lb. baked ham.
4 oz. grated Parmesan
sprigs of parsley

Cut toast into triangles, arrange in baking dish. Place turkey on toast and cover with hot cheese sauce, to with tomato and bacon. Sprinkle with Parmesan and bake at 400 until bubbly.

Serve hot with Mint Juleps and Derby Pie.
