

U.S. SAILING NATIONAL YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS AT BAY-WAVELAND

Cellular South announced their major sponsorship of the 1996 U.S. Sailing National Youth Championships to be held in June at the Bay-Waveland Yacht Club.

In making the announcement, Cellular South stated, "We are pleased to sponsor this premier racing event and salute Bay-Waveland Yacht Club as the host of the championships. We feel that sailing offers these young athletes a clean, safe, and fun sport which incorporates an awareness and respect for the environment. It builds an immediate and real sense of worth that comes from being able to compete with the very best this country has to offer."

The U.S. Sailing National Youth Championship was established in 1973 and is the only open national youth championship. It is recognized in the sailing world as the "pinnacle" for teenage sailboat racers. The event is open to any United States sailor under age 20 by application, but only 150 to 160 of the top junior sailors in the country are accepted. U.S. Sailing, the national authority, makes the selections based primarily on the entrants' sailing ability and experience.

The goal of the event is to provide world-class sailing competition with a strong educational foundation. Olympic level coaches run a two-day seminar. This is followed by four days of intense racing with evening replays and discussions of technique. The top finishers in each class will be invited to other national level events.

Cellular South Account Executive and member of the host Club, Cary Trapani, stated, "This competition is the best offered to the youth of this country, and I am proud to be associated with the sponsor and the host of the championships."
