4th of JULY UPPER DECK PARTY

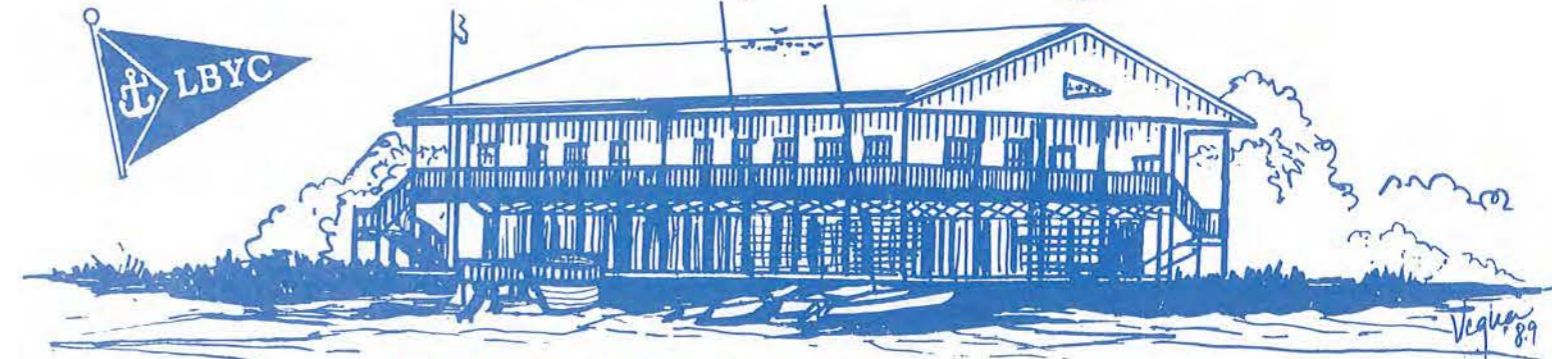
