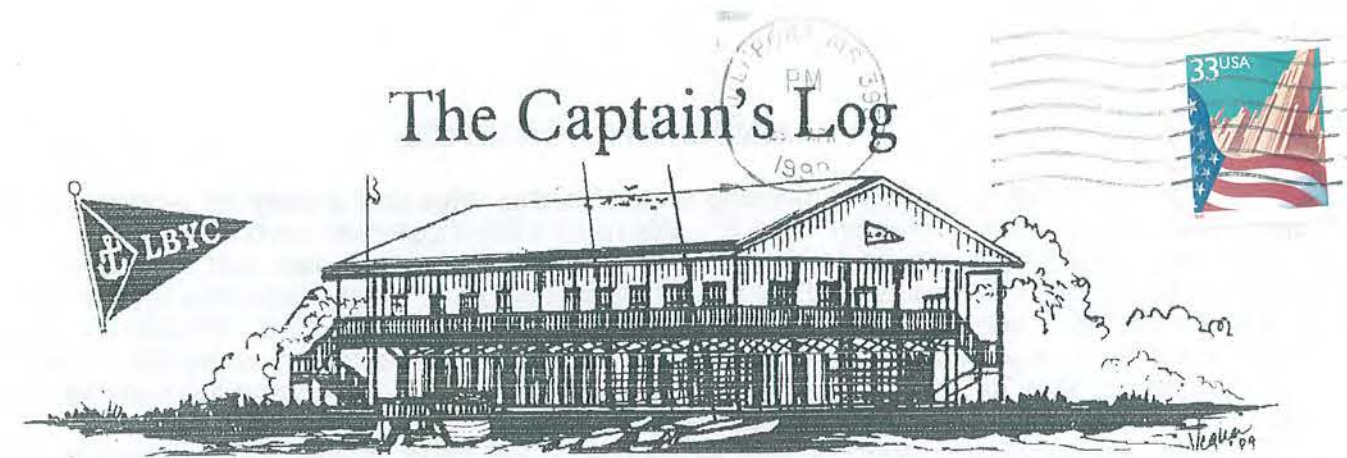

## HANDICAP RAMP NEWS NOTES

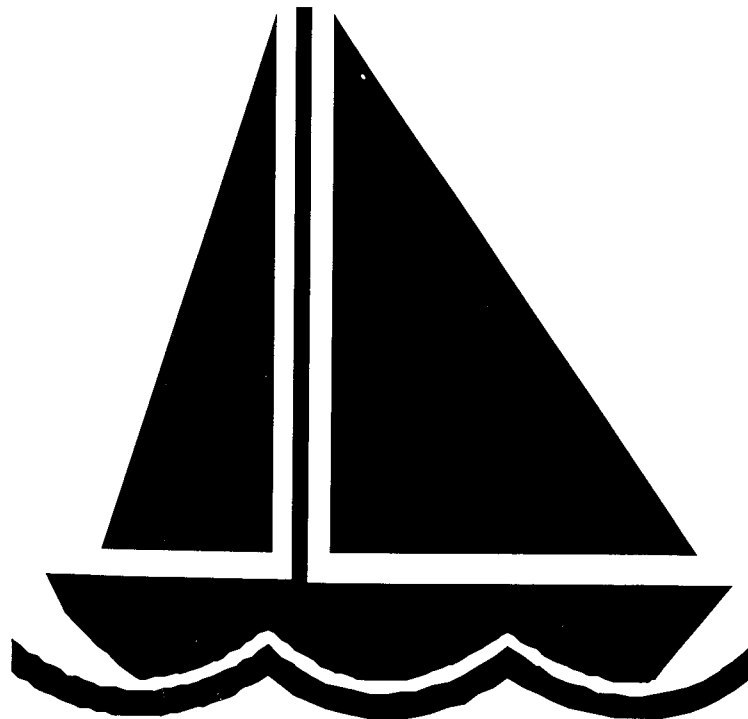
Hey! We're "doing good!" Thanks to so many who would like to see the handicap ramp completed, we're really doing well.

## A REMINDER OF POOL RULES

Please review Article XIII and Article XXIII of the Club rules; they **will** be enforced! No sun tan oil IN the pool (shower before entering!) – No pets at the Club – No food or glass (including dishes, drink glasses, bottles or ashtrays) in the pool enclosure; food may be consumed in the observation area.

Also, please observe the following:

- Small children should be supervised at all times and not left alone; we do not have a lifeguard.
- Food is available from topside; however, please return all dishes to the upper deck after eating below.
- All trash should be placed in the containers available on the deck.
- Return all tables and chairs to the setup where you found them.
- If you are the last one out of the pool area, PLEASE lock the gate.
- Let's all work to keep our pool area in a condition to be enjoyed by all.
