World Class Junior Sailor—Ricky Welch

Four years ago Ricky Welch aged-out of his Optimist Class career on a high note qualifying and competing in the Optimist World Sailing Championship in Argentina as part of Team USA. Today...Ricky has his sights set on the 2018 Laser Radial Youth Worlds Championship in Kiel, Germany in August.

Recently, Ricky was selected to represent the U.S. and compete in the world regatta along with an invitation to be a part of the US Sailing Olympic Development Program travel team. He continues to train along with teammates under the guidance of Rosie Chapman of the Gulf Coast Youth Sailing Association, who was named US Sailing Coach of the Year in April.

Ricky's success comes from hard work and dedication to what he is inspired to do. Simplicity and focus are the factors he seeks each time he takes to the water in a laser competition. It's a strategy that the 17-year-old Long Beach High School senior is continually improving on. It's one that helped him recently win first place in the Laser Radial Class at the 2018 U.S. Nationals in Houston, Texas, and 3rd Place at the 2018 U.S. Youth Championship in Wrightsville Beach, N.C., bringing home a bronze medal.

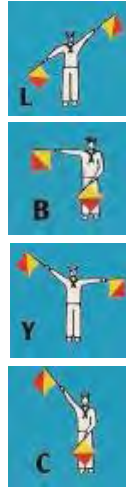
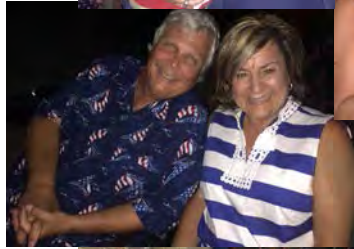
